

## Infection Prevention and Control



Steven Wilson Seating (SWS) is committed to meeting its commitment in relation to the health and safety of its workforce and those who encounter its operations.

Hand hygiene is one of the most effective and basic measure to prevent the spread of infection.

'Wash Wipe Cover' Brochure/ Fact Sheets (SA Health) and 'Donning and Doffing sequence' is displayed at SWS Clinic.

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### The following measures are taken at Steven Wilson Seating to prevent and reduce the spread of infectious diseases.

- All staff at SWS will wear a P2 mask, gloves and protective eyewear during all client interactions (\*unless medical exemption applies).
- Where home visits or assessments at alternative locations, all PPE is applied prior to the appointment at the SWS staff vehicle.
- PPE items are to be applied and removed using SA Health donning and doffing principles including moments of hand hygiene.
- Social distancing is encouraged during the clinic appointments where appropriate.
- SWS staff are not to attend work when feeling unwell.
- Masks and hand sanitiser are available for clients and/or carer attending the clinic.
- **We ask that you do not attend your appointment if feeling unwell. Please contact Steven Wilson Seating to reschedule.**
